Golf Continues to Dominate NCCGA

UNH's Golf team traveled to Cocheco Country Club in Dover on September 30th. They earned their second straight sweep of a National Collegiate Club Golf Association Tournament. UNH's Blue squad came in first with a total score of 307 while their White squad followed up with a second place finish with 320 points. On top of that, UNH golfer Dan Kish and CJ Konkowski were named the medalist and co-medalist of the tournament.

Then, the Golf team then traveled to Casperkill Country Club in Poughkeepsie, NY for the NCCGA Northeast Regional during the weekend of October 6th and 7th. The team ended the first day of the match

with a 13 stroke lead. Despite the frigid conditions, the team was able to keep their lead on Boston College and place first in the tournament.

On top of the first place finish, the team also had a number of members honored at the tournament. Troy Goliber was named the medalist of the match for carding a 76 on both Saturday and Sunday giving him a final score of 152. Also, CJ Konkowski and Danny Kish were named to the Northeast All-Team for finishing in the top 8.

The next regional qualifier, which will determine who qualifies for Nationals, is the weekend of October 27

and 28 at Wilkes-Barre Golf Club in Bear Creek Township, PA.
